

CELEBRATING THEIR 20TH SEASON TOGETHER MICHAEL TILSON THOMAS & THE SAN FRANCISCO SYMPHONY RELEASE MASTERPIECES IN MINIATURE RECORDING ON SFS MEDIA NOVEMBER 11, 2014

Collection of short works by Mahler, Debussy, Schubert, Dvořák, Sibelius, Ives and featuring Pianist Yuja Wang in Litolff's Scherzo from Concerto symphonique No. 4

SAN FRANCISCO, October 15, 2014 – In honor of their twentieth season together, Music Director Michael Tilson Thomas (MTT) and the San Francisco Symphony (SFS) release *Masterpieces in Miniature*, a collection of short orchestral works, on their in-house label SFS Media. The recording is available November 11 on CD and can be pre-ordered as a digital download from iTunes.com/SFSymphony or on CD from SFSymphony.org/store. *Masterpieces in Miniature* includes Henry Litolff's Scherzo from *Concerto symphonique* No. 4 featuring pianist Yuja Wang, Gustav Mahler's *Blumine*, Charles Ives / Henry Brant's "The Alcotts" from *A Concord Symphony*, Gabriel Fauré's *Pavane*, Claude Debussy's *La Plus que lente*, Franz Schubert's Entracte No. 3 from *Rosamunde*, Sergei Rachmaninoff's Vocalise, Antonín Dvořák's *Legend* for Orchestra, Jean Sibelius's *Valse triste*, Frederick Delius's *On Hearing the First Cuckoo in Spring*, Edvard Grieg's *The*

Last Spring, Léo Delibes's Cortège de Bacchus from Sylvia, all recorded live in performance at Davies Symphony Hall. With this collection MTT shares some of his most treasured musical memories.

About the recording MTT says, "The short pieces in this album exist in various versions. Many began as piano pieces but were, except for the Ives, orchestrated by their composers. They were often played as encores by musicians who took special delight finding the most personal way of presenting them. This recording pays homage to the tradition of these pieces. It marks the beginning of my twentieth season as Music Director of the San Francisco Symphony and my seventieth birthday. On these occasions, I wanted to give a present to our whole San Francisco family and to our listeners everywhere. What better way than to fashion a garland of these charming pieces? Playing them is now nearly a lost art. The musicians and I have taken a wonderful voyage in creating these performances, which are a mixture of my musical memories and the imagination and virtuosity of my colleagues."

As acclaimed interpreters of the music of Mahler, MTT and the Orchestra have included their performance of the composer's *Blumine* as part of this special collection. Their self-produced Mahler recording project, launched in 2001 and concluded in 2010, encompassed all of Mahler's symphonies and works for voice, chorus and orchestra. The Orchestra's Mahler cycle on SFS Media has been recognized with seven Grammy Awards and MTT was named *Gramophone* Artist of the Year in recognition of his work on the recording cycle. For the 2011 Mahler centennial, the SFS performed his music in a four-concert engagement at the famed Vienna Konzerthaus in May, an honor rarely extended to American orchestras and a keystone of the city's commemoration of the Mahler anniversary. MTT and the SFS's *Keeping Score: Mahler* PBS Television documentary and concert is available on DVD and Blu-ray.

MTT and the SFS's recording of "The Alcotts" movement from *A Concord Symphony*, an orchestration of Charles Ives's "Concord" Sonata arranged by Henry Brant, was originally released in a 2011 recording of the full work. In his *San Francisco Chronicle* review, Joshua Kosman wrote, "To listen to 'A Concord Symphony'...is to feel an exhilarating sense of discovery and dramatic vigor, an explosive dynamism that emanates from all the participants...Thomas and the orchestra...convey every bit of the score's boisterous vitality in a performance of magnificent virtuosity - it's a landmark achievement."

Yuja Wang has appeared with the SFS every season since her debut at the Orchestra's 2006 Chinese New Year concert. Her most recent performance with MTT and the SFS was Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue* at the 2014-15 season Opening Gala. She will return to Davies Symphony Hall this season to perform in Liszt's Hexameron (for five pianists) with MTT and the SFS for MTT's 70th birthday gala on January 15, and in Shostakovich's Piano Concerto No. 1 with MTT conducting the London Symphony Orchestra on March 22 and Gershwin's Piano Concerto in F on March 23. She performed Prokofiev's Piano Concerto No. 2 with the Orchestra in 2009, as well as on tour throughout Asia with MTT and the SFS in 2012. Her most recent recording, *Brahms: The Violin Sonatas* with Leonidas Kavakos was released in March 2014.

ABOUT THE SAN FRANCISCO SYMPHONY

<u>The San Francisco Symphony</u>, widely considered to be among the most artistically adventurous and innovative arts institutions in the US, celebrated its Centennial season in 2011-12. Led by Michael Tilson Thomas, who begins his 20th season as Music Director in 2014-15, the SFS presents more than 220 concerts annually, and reaches an audience of nearly 600,000 in its home of Davies Symphony Hall, through its multifaceted education and community programs, and a global audience through its media initiatives and on national and international tours.

SFS Media is the San Francisco Symphony's in-house label, launched in 2001. SFS Media records and releases audio and visual material reflecting the Orchestra and Music Director Michael Tilson Thomas' commitment to showcasing music by maverick composers as well as

core classical masterworks. The recordings reflect the broad range of programming that has been a hallmark of the MTT/SFS partnership. Recorded live in concert and engineered at Davies Symphony Hall, the audio recordings are released on hybrid SACD and in high-resolution digital formats. SFS Media has garnered eight Grammy awards. SFS Media also produces and releases documentary and live performance videos, including the SFS's national public television series and multimedia project *Keeping Score*, which included three seasons of television episodes, eight documentaries, and eight concert films designed to make classical music more accessible to people of all ages and musical backgrounds, available on DVD and Blu-ray. Other videos of the San Francisco Symphony available from SFS Media include *A Celebration of Leonard Bernstein: Opening Night at Carnegie Hall 2008* and *San Francisco Symphony at 100*, a documentary about the Symphony's history, which won a Northern California Emmy Award for "Historical/Cultural Program or Special" in 2012.
