**ADDITIONAL SAN FRANCISCO SYMPHONY CONCERTS AT DAVIES SYMPHONY HALL  
AFFECTED BY COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**

**SAN FRANCISCO, CA**—The following Davies Symphony Hall concerts are affected by increased measures to slow the spread of COVID-19, in addition to the previously announced cancellations of all San Francisco Symphony concerts March 7–25.

**[An Evening with Bernadette Peters](#) will be rescheduled for this summer. Ticket holders will be contacted with the new date soon.** Please note that if you are able to attend on the rescheduled date, no action is required. Your tickets will be valid in the same seats you purchased. If you are unable to attend on the new date, see outlined options below.

The following concerts have been canceled (new additions in bold):

March 12–14: MTT & Gautier Capuçon

March 15: Youth Orchestra Plays Britten

March 17: Flute Recital with Sir James Galway

March 22: Buster Keaton's *The General*—Silent Film with Organist Cameron Carpenter

March 22: Piano Recital with Hélène Grimaud

**April 4: Music for Families: *Meet the Orchestra*, featuring the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra**

**April 4: San Francisco Symphony Chorus: J.S. Bach's *Magnificat***

- Consider exchanging tickets for MTT & Brahms' *A German Requiem* on May 22–24 and MTT & Mahler: *Symphony of a Thousand* on June 25–28.

Ticketholders are encouraged to consider exchanging or donating the cost of their ticket back to the San Francisco Symphony. This helps support the organization as an arts nonprofit during this challenging time as we navigate the significant, ongoing impact of the COVID-19 situation. The following options are available for those who have already purchased tickets to canceled concerts:

- Exchange your tickets for any future 2019–20 Season performance. All exchange fees will be waived in this situation.
- Exchange your tickets for a gift certificate, which can be used at any time.
- Donate your tickets and receive a tax deduction for the total ticket value.

- Receive a refund for the value of the ticket.
