CONCERT CANCELLATIONS AT DAVIES SYMPHONY HALL EXTENDED THROUGH MARCH 25

SAN FRANCISCO, **CA**—San Francisco Mayor London N. Breed today announced that the Health Officer of the City and County of San Francisco will issue a Public Health Order prohibiting all large group events of 1,000 or more persons through March 25. This measure is necessary to slow the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in the community and builds on the City's public health recommendations announced on March 6. In addition to previously announced cancellations of all San Francisco Symphony concerts at Davies Symphony Hall March 7–20, all concerts scheduled through March 25 are now canceled as well.

The following upcoming concerts have been canceled (new additions in bold):

March 12–14: MTT & Gautier Capuçon March 15: Youth Orchestra Plays Britten

March 17: Flute Recital with Sir James Galway

March 22: Buster Keaton's The General—Silent Film with Organist Cameron Carpenter

March 22: Piano Recital with Hélène Grimaud

The following options are available for those who have already purchased tickets to canceled concerts:

- Exchange your tickets for any future 2019–20 Season performance. All exchange fees will be waived in this situation.
- Exchange your tickets for a gift certificate, which can be used at any time.
- Donate your tickets and receive a tax deduction for the total ticket value.
- Receive a refund for the value of the ticket.
