Digital Projects

November 14, 2020

Throughline: San Francisco Symphony—From Hall to Home (released November 14, 2020) Esa-Pekksa Salonen and the San Frnacisco Symphony released *Throughline: San Francisco Symphony—From Hall to Home* in November 2020 to launch Esa-Pekka's first season as Music Director. The free concert event featured all eight Collaborative Partners and reflected the forward-looking creativity of the SF Symphony and the vibrant personalities of the Bay Area and beyond. The event included music by Ellen Reid, John Adams, Kev Choice, Beethoven, and the world premiere of *Throughline*, a new SF Symphony commission by Nico Muhly filmed in locations around the world.

Igor Stravinsky's *The Soldier's Tale* (Released June 1, 2022)

Director Netia Jones teams up with Esa-Pekka Salonen, actor Bruce Davison, dancer Adji Cissoko, and musicians of the San Francisco Symphony to present a new digital production of Igor Stravinsky's The Soldier's Tale. Salonen calls the piece, a darkly comic story about a soldier's encounters with the devil, a "complete change of paradigm" following the horrors of World War I and the influenza pandemic.'

LIGETI: PARADIGMS (released January 18, 2022)

Music Director Esa-Pekka Salonen leads members of the SF Symphony and Chorus in LIGETI: PARADIGMS, a richly imaginative audio and visual exploration of three works by György Ligeti. Merging music with Artificial Intelligence (AI) through partnerships with media artist and AI pioneer Refik Anadol and SF Symphony Collaborative Partner and roboticist Carol Reiley, this program aims to expand the possibilities of the orchestral experience.

Digital SoundBox programs released in 2020-21 season

Nostalgia: Esa-Pekka Salonen_(released February 4, 2021)

SF Symphony Music Director Esa-Pekka Salonen curates and conducts a SoundBox program. Nostalgia is a longing to return home, but what if that home isn't there anymore? In SoundBox: Nostalgia, three composers look to a past that may or may not exist, while opening new portals to the future.

Patterns: Esa-Pekka Salonen (released April 15, 2021)

SF Symphony Music Director Esa-Pekka Salonen curates and conducts a SoundBox program. Patterns build on one another, in a magical and complex dance of design. SoundBox: Patterns looks to the distant past and cornerstones of musical Minimalism to reveal the structure within.
